1. Call to Order

Tyler Lupkes called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

Tyler Lupkes asked that two items be added for discussion; Ebola response and violence against EMS providers and how to better share EMS intelligence between agencies.

Motion made by (Pritchard/Ostman) to approve the amended November 2022 EP meeting amended agenda. Approved.

3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Motion made by (Quinn/Pritchard) to approve the September 6, 2022 EP meeting minutes. Approved.

5. Discussion Items

A. EP Subcommittee Bylaws

Tyler Lupkes said the by-laws were distributed to members for review and discussion, in particular the attendance section.

Greg Hayes said the comments he received will be part of a draft for the TOC to review and advise. Two comments of note have been to refer to the 17 agencies as the region, and the other comment was if the other sub-committees are still necessary.

B. Metro Region Disaster Compact Workgroup

Tyler Osman said Hayes sent out a copy of the draft of the disaster compact. The purpose of possible revisions would be to clarify if the compact is continual or on a spectrum.

Ostman said he suggests removing the word "disaster".

C. EMS MACC Guidelines Workgroup

Tyler Lupkes said there was a re-branding of the MACC, now known as the EMS EOC. It is hoped this workgroup will get back together this 4th quarter to define and clarify the EMS EOC workgroup guidelines.

D. MESB EMS Equipment Workgroup

Tyler Ostman said it is a work in progress. A spreadsheet will be made.

Greg Hayes said the inventory of the higher dollar assets has been made. The lesser dollar inventory is in progress. The generator and air conditioners have been tested and all are working fine.

E. Bus Use for Rehab Operations

Greg Hayes said the intention is to have the bus moved out of St. Francis and onto an EMS agency property. Hayes is meeting with Jill Rohret today to work on a draft agreement.

Hayes said he wants to change the ability to have the bus deployed. Ron Bombeck is the only driver at this time.

F. MNTRAC for Events Testing

Greg Hayes said he and Tyler Lupkes have been testing out MNTRAC over the summer for special events. Other systems are being considered.

G. Ebola response – added to agenda

Nick Lesch said M Health Fairview is one of seven Response Centers for Ebola in the state.

There is a grant. The state is having a meeting in a couple of weeks.

There are seven receiving centers. Isopods have become a hot ticket item, and most of them have been allocated to the military.

There is a point of contact updated list should be made. This could be a good first exercise in information sharing.

There is a meeting November 16th of the Collaborative Workshop Group at MDH.

H. EMS Services & MRCC Updates

Tyler Ostman said two weeks ago a crew of two were assaulted by gunfire while parked at a gas station. Hennepin EMS will be looking for data on EMS assaults.

Greg Hayes suggested a two-hour assault injury review online meeting

Hayes said his survey revealed that 3ECHO; the acts of violence training was the favored training, followed by Leadership Training classes. NFPA3000 is the act of violence response. NFPA3000 was approved by fire It was the first standard to encompass all disciplines.

Hayes grants for EMS safety could potentially be on the table.

I. MESB Progress Reports

a. Grants

Greg Hayes said the planning for the 2023-2024 planning will begin in May.

b. Training

Hayes said there is some grant funding for NUMS courses. Moving the training around in the metro is a good option.
